A total of 8,700 GAR posts have been identified to date, still 2,300 posts short - *The Banner* - page 11 Summary of work done by Ken Nelson - Compiling a GAR reference guide of posts, post commanders, department encampments, national encampments and information of interest. This work will most likely appear in two volumes. The last National Encampment of the GAR was held in Indianapolis, Indiana, in 1949. Six of the sixteen surviving members of the GAR attended. Ken has to date identified 7,500 post and over 1,000 post commanders.

GAR Highway Sign Project

US Route 6 was designated as the national route honoring the Grand Army of the Republic through Congressional action on June 30, 1937. At that time, House Joint Resolution 60 required all states which included US Route 6 to name the highway in honor of the GAR and to sign it accordingly.
